Located at 46 Ave & 50 Street. The centre is open 7 days a week. The Centre will accept recyclables from the residential and commercial sector.

NEWSPRINT &  
MIXED PAPER

Newspaper and all newspaper inserts and All paper that is not newsprint including:

- Bond Paper
- Magazines (no glued spines)
- Envelopes
- Office Paper
- Paper bags
- Telephone Books
- Catalogues

CARDBOARD

Should be flattened

- Includes cereal, chip, laundry & tissue boxes, corrugated cardboard
- **NO** milk cartons, juice boxes or egg cartons

MILK CONTAINERS

**Effective June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2009**, milk jugs and milk cartons can be returned to the Bottle Depot for a refund.

TIN CANS

Rinsed with labels removed

- Should be flattened
- Include metal lids from glass jars and containers

CLEAR GLASS

Clear Glass bottles and jars only

- Must be clean
- No lids
- No plates or ceramics
- No automotive glass

PLASTIC

All #1, #2, #3, #4 & #5 HDPE Plastics (Hand Soap, Bleach, Fabric Softener, Laundry Detergent, Shampoo, etc.)

USED OIL:

Can be taken to the Bottle Depot Highway 2A & 57 Avenue

PLASTIC GROCERY BAGS: Drop off at Hamilton's IGA

OLD ELECTRONICS: Ponoka County Transfer Station 38<sup>th</sup> Avenue (Wed. & Sat.)

CELL PHONES, CHARGERS AND RECYCLABLE BATTERIES (EG. CORDLESS DRILLS, LAPTOP COMPUTERS, CAMCORDERS, DIGITAL CAMERAS, REMOTE CONTROL TOYS, CORDLESS PHONE BATTERY PACKS): Drop off at the Fire Hall

NICKEL CADMIUM (NI-CD), NICKEL METAL HYDRIDE (NI-MH), LITHIUM ION (LI-ION), AND SMALL SEALED RECHARGEABLE BATTERIES:  
Drop off at the Fire Hall

<u>BLUE BUILDING:</u>	<u>Minimum charge \$7.50 for 125 kg.</u> \$60.00 per tonne Solid wastes, garbage, furniture, drywall, toilets, shingles, plastics, etc.
<u>METAL:</u>	<u>Minimum charge \$7.50 for 300 kg.</u> \$25.00 per tonne White goods Cable cut in 3 ft length, wire and general scrape
<u>WOOD:</u>	<u>Minimum charge \$7.50</u> \$10.00 per tonne
<u>CONCRETE/ASPHALT:</u>	<u>\$15.00 per tonne</u> Must be clean (No garbage)
<u>BRANCHES:</u>	<u>No charge - to be put in its own pile</u>
<u>COMPOSTABLE MATERIAL:</u>	<u>No charge - grass, leaves, garden scraps</u>
<u>TIRES:</u>	<u>No charge - no rims on tires</u>
<u>PROPANE BOTTLES:</u>	<u>\$5.00 each</u>

**EXCLUDED WASTES**

1. Bulk liquids and wastes with free liquid.
2. Hazardous wastes.
3. Radioactive wastes.
4. Industrial wastes.
5. Burning or hot wastes/ashes
6. Automobiles or other large metal objects.
7. Hydrocarbon contaminated earth.
8. Sulfurous wastes/soil.
9. Batteries
10. Earth.
11. Agricultural herbicide/  
pesticide containers.
12. Manure.
13. Demolition debris.
14. Dead Animals.
15. Asbestos Insulation

\*Rubble from fires must be clean and separated.

\*Effective September 1, 2010 a \$20.00 surcharge will be added for all loads that are not properly secured/covered to prevent items blowing off the vehicle onto the streets and roads accessing the Waste Transfer Facility.\*
